College Goal Wisconsin Helps Students and Their Families with FAFSA

Wausau, WI -- Since 2006, over 22,000 Wisconsin students have received free help completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at College Goal Wisconsin events held throughout the state. Financial aid professionals and other educators volunteer at the event to help students and their families complete the FAFSA.

Anyone who is planning to pursue a postsecondary education in the 2019-20 academic year should complete the FAFSA. The FAFSA is the form that must be submitted in order to be considered for federal and state financial aid including grants and loans. Students pursuing a postsecondary education in 201-20 can complete the FAFSA beginning October 1, 2018.

Forty-two College Goal Wisconsin events will take place between October 3 and November 8. The events will take place on the following dates: October 3, October 8, October 10, October 15, October 17, October 22, October 24, November 5, November 7, and November 8. In addition to getting professional help completing the FAFSA, attendees will have the opportunity to enter a scholarship drawing. The scholarship can be used at any private or public accredited college/university in the United States. The winner must be attending college in the fall of 2019 as a full time undergraduate student.
